WHAT IS A CHAPLAIN?

The Chaplain is an ordained clergy person (minister, priest, rabbi, or imam) who serves Sailors, Marines, and their families with worship services, pastoral counseling, and privileged communication, to ensure spiritual needs are met.

WHAT IS AN RP?

Religious Program Specialists (RP) manage and execute the Command Religious Program (CRP) in accord with the diverse religious ministry requirements of Navy and Marine Corps personnel and their families; accommodate religious ministry requirements; support the provision of religious ministry; facilitate the free exercise of religion for all Sea Service personnel; support the delivery of care as part of the Religious Ministry Team (RMT); advise leadership on morale, ethical decision-making, cross-cultural awareness, and conflict resolution; and, provide force protection expertise for RMT;s in expeditionary environments.
