Subj: CONTROL OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ABOARD MARINE CORPS AIR STATION YUMA

1. Purpose. To add and update Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) facilities to the basic order.

2. Action

a. On page 2, section 4, paragraph d, item (4), add:

(1) (wine, and distilled spirits) to the Lake Martinez Camp Store.

b. On page 2, section 4, paragraph e, add items:

(1) (10) Fitness Center Main Gymnasium (Building 545) during special events and athletic events in the main gymnasium. (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(2) (11) Station Theater during special events. (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

c. On page 2, section 4, paragraph f, item (6), delete and replace with:

(1) "Consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized at Memorial Sports Complex, Myers Park, all softball, soccer and Paint Ball Park fields when reserved through the MCCS Semper Fit Gym Bldg. 545 or the AZ Adventures facility. Reservations made through MCCS constitute permission from the MCAS Yuma Commanding Officer for the consumption of alcohol. Glass containers are not permitted and all alcoholic beverage containers must be disposed appropriately."

3. Filing Instructions. File this Change transmittal immediately behind the signature page of the basic Order.

Subj: CONTROL OF ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES ABOARD MARINE CORPS AIR STATION YUMA

Ref: (a) OPNAVISNT 1700.16
(b) MCO 1700.22F
(c) Arizona Title 4, Liquor Law

1. Situation. The term "alcoholic beverages" means wine, distilled spirits, beer, and malt beverages. This order establishes policies and provides requirements for implementation of Alcoholic Beverage Control (ABC) measures and programs for the purpose of protecting individuals, and preserving unit readiness aboard Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Yuma.

2. Cancellation. StaO 1746.2V.

3. Mission

a. This order establishes the MCAS Yuma policy for the administration and management of ABC, focusing on: prevention efforts; establishment of minimum possession and drinking age; employment of personnel to dispense alcoholic beverage, sale of packaged alcoholic beverage; sale, possession, and consumption by the drink; and the possession of alcohol in government quarters.

b. References (a) and (b) contain general provisions for the control of alcoholic beverages for on shore establishments. Reference (c) establishes the laws and regulations enacted by the State of Arizona regarding sale, dispensing, possession, consumption, and transportation of alcoholic beverages.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent. To preserve unit readiness, Esprit de corps, and safety of Marines, Sailors, and their families aboard MCAS Yuma ensuring all personnel aboard MCAS Yuma are aware of the policies regarding alcoholic beverages and to ensure each member of the command understands their personal responsibility for policing and administering the privileges of possessing and consumption of alcoholic beverages.

(2) Concept of Operations. Measures to prevent and deter abuse are an integral part of the management of alcoholic beverages on MCAS Yuma. The sale of alcoholic beverages during recreational activities will be balanced with non-alcoholic beverages to encourage healthy lifestyles for Marines, Sailors, and family members.

b. Minimum Possession and Drinking Age

(1) Possession or consumption of alcoholic beverages while under the age of 21 years is prohibited. Knowingly selling or providing alcohol to anyone under the age of 21 is prohibited.

(2) In accordance with reference (b), an exception to policy for underage drinking must be submitted to the Commanding Officer (CO), MCAS Yuma. Approval via electronic or hard-copy correspondence will be presented to the establishment on the installation where the event is to be held.

c. Employment of personnel to serve alcoholic beverages

(1) No person shall be employed within the installation as a bartender or in any other capacity involving the sale or dispensing of alcoholic beverages below 21 years of age. Marine Corps Community Services (MCCS) employees involved in the sale, dispensing, or serving of alcoholic beverages will be trained in exercising ABC to encourage responsible consumption.

(2) This policy does not apply to employees in MCCS retail outlets which sell packaged alcoholic beverages and must be at least 16 years of age if supervised by a person on the premises who is at least 19 years of age. This paragraph also does not prohibit the employment of a person under the age of 19 years who, while bussing tables comes into contact with dirty dishes and glassware containing alcohol properly sold and served.

d. Sale of Packaged Alcoholic Beverages. Packaged alcoholic beverages will only be sold aboard the installation at the following locations. The hours of sale for alcoholic beverages in MCX Retail facilities are in accordance with reference (c) and published via separate correspondence.

(1) Main Exchange (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(2) Marine Mart (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(3) Cannon Air Defense Complex Marine Mart (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(4) Lake Martinez Camp Store (beer only).

e. Sale, Possession and Consumption by the Drink. Sale of alcoholic beverages by the drink for consumption on the premises is authorized at the following MCCS facilities:

(1) Sonoran Pueblo Consolidated Club (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(2) MCX Food Court establishments (beer and wine only).

(3) Cactus Bowling Center (beer, wine, and distilled spirits).

(4) Lake Martinez Recreation Area (beer, wine, and miniature-sized containers).

(5) Dos Rios Inn (sales are limited to miniature-sized containers of distilled spirits, wine, and individual containers of malt beverages for on-premises possession and consumption in rooms or suites).

(6) Single Marine Program (SMP) Recreation Center outdoor pavilion areas (beer and wine only).

(7) Oasis Pool (beer and wine only). No glass containers.

(8) Installation exterior locations utilized as an integral component to MCCS Recreational/Business programming to include activities such as concerts, Barracks Bash events, open houses, air shows, etc.

(9) The hours of sale for by the drink sales of alcoholic beverages in MCCS facilities are in accordance with reference (c) and published via separate correspondence.

f. Possession and Consumption in Government Quarters or Facilities. Individuals 21 years of age and older may possess and consume alcoholic beverages in government and public-private venture (PPV) quarters/facilities as follows:

(1) Married officers' quarters.

(2) Bachelor officers' quarters.

(3) Married enlisted quarters.

(4) Bachelor SNCOs' quarters.

(5) Bachelor enlisted quarters.

(6) Athletic Fields. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized at Ramada Field, Myers Park, all softball, and soccer fields when reserved through the MCCS Semper Fit Gym office. Reservations made through MCCS constitute permission from the MCAS Yuma Commanding Officer for the consumption of alcohol. Glass containers are not permitted, and all alcoholic beverage containers must be disposed of appropriately.

(7) 16th Street and MCAS Yuma Community Centers. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized at both community centers when reserved through the MCCS Transient Lodging Facility (TLF) Dos Rios Inn office. Reservations made through MCCS constitute permission from the MCAS Yuma Commanding Officer for the consumption of alcohol.

(8) Squadron Conference Rooms/Debrief spaces. Consumption of alcoholic beverages is authorized by the Commanding Officer of MCAS Yuma.

g. Transportation. Government-owned vehicles or aircraft will not be used to transport alcoholic beverages for recreational use except when approved by the unit commanding officer.

h. Administrative Regulation. MCCS locations that sell packaged alcoholic beverages shall prominently post a notice in the sales area stating persons transporting alcoholic beverages off this station become subject to the laws of the State of Arizona.

i. Prohibited Activities. The following is prohibited for military personnel aboard MCAS Yuma:

(1) Except as specifically authorized in this order, the sale, purchase, possession, and consumption of alcoholic beverages aboard MCAS Yuma is prohibited.

(2) A person buying alcoholic beverages at a MCCS location aboard MCAS Yuma that sells packaged alcoholic beverages is prohibited from reselling or bartending these beverages.

(3) Except where authorized, possession on one's person of any bottle, can, or other receptacle containing any alcoholic beverage which has been opened, or has a seal broken, is prohibited.

(4) No person shall transfer, sell, or cause to be transferred or sold, any alcoholic beverage to a person under the age of 21 aboard MCAS Yuma except as approved by the installation commander.


5. Coordinating Instructions. Possession and consumption of alcoholic beverages may be prohibited for limited periods when it is determined that military operation or the requirements of good order and discipline require such action. Commanders who take this action shall publish a document stating the reason for the limited prohibition, affected location, and either its anticipated length or the conditions that must be met before they will lift the limited prohibition. Commanders will forward copies of this document to the next senior commander in the chain of command and either to the Staff Judge Advocate (SJA), Marine Corps Installations Command or the SJA, 3d Marine Aircraft Wing, as appropriate.

6. Administration and Logistics. Recommendations concerning the contents of this Order may be forwarded to the Director MCCS, MCAS Yuma via the appropriate chain of command.

7. Command and Signal

a. Command. Subordinate and tenant CO's shall ensure that each member of the command and all duty personnel understand the policies pertaining to the possession and consumption of permitted alcoholic beverages.

b. Signal. This Order is effective the date signed.
