Subj: MARINE CORPS COMMUNITY SERVICES (MCCS) MULTI-DISCIPLINARY COUNCIL

1. Situation. To assure that all quality of life services and programs for Marines and their families while stationed at Marine Corps Air Station (MCAS) Yuma are adequately addressed. To accomplish this, the Station Commanding Officer can choose to establish the MCCS Multi-Disciplinary Council.

2. Cancellation. StaO 1700.8.

3. Mission. The mission of the MCCS Multi-Disciplinary Council is to act as an advisory body to the Commanding Officer, via the MCCS Director, on matters relating to MCCS program issues. A number of MCCS programs have requirements from the Department of Defense (DoD) for separate councils and advisory committees. The Multi-Disciplinary Council is meant to satisfy all requirements in one group. The council may review those issues addressed by these separate councils and committees and advise the commander.

4. Execution

a. Commander's Intent and Concept of Operations

(1) Commander's Intent To establish the MCAS Yuma MCCS Multi-Disciplinary Council and define its mission and operating procedures.

(2) Concept of Operations

(a) This order establishes an MCCS Multi-Disciplinary Council which will provide advice to the Commanding Officer, MCAS Yuma on important MCCS program issues.

(b) Members of the council should be appointed in writing by the Commanding Officer.

(c) The council should include membership from the senior supported Operational Commander(s).

(d) Council will meet annually.

(e) This council may review those issues addressed by the:

1. Family Advocacy Committee.
2. Family Readiness Council.
3. Lifelong Learning Advisory Council.
4. Morale, Welfare, and Recreation (MWR) Advisory Group.
5. Parent Advisory Board.
6. Relocation Assistance Coordinating Committee.

(f) The council may advise the Commander on the overall operation of the MCCS program and make recommendations for improvement.

5. Administration and Logistics. Recommendations concerning the contents of this order may be forwarded to the Director MCCS, MCAS Yuma via the appropriate chain of command.

6. Command and Signal

a. Command. Subordinate and Tenant Commanding Officers should be involved with this council to continue the dialogue between units and MCCS for ample and relevant quality of life services and programs for the Marines and families of MCAS Yuma.

b. Signal. This order is effective the date signed.
