CONSERVING THE LANDSCAPE AND THE DOD MISSION

As the manager and primary user of the 700k acre Barry M. Goldwater Range West (BMGR-W), the U.S. Marine Corps (USMC) is responsible for maintaining the ecological integrity of the range, while simultaneously providing a realistic training environment for our nation's warfighters. Additionally, the Military Lands Withdrawal Act of 1999 and the Sikes Act mandates that the USMC develop and adhere to an Integrated Natural Resources Management Plan (INRMP) which "includes provisions for proper management and protection of the natural and cultural resources of the range, and for sustainable use by the public of such resources to the extent consistent with military purposes." The INRMP for the BMGR-W requires that baseline surveys for small mammals, reptiles, and amphibians be established so that natural resource managers may determine how best to allocate efforts to protect these resources. The information presented in this brochure is a product of that objective and is being provided to increase public awareness and enhance the visitor experience.
