Major Windt was born in Morris Plains, New Jersey and graduated from Morristown High School in 1998. He earned his Bachelor of Science degree in Systems Engineering from the United States Naval Academy and commissioned as a Second Lieutenant upon graduation in 2006.

Major Windt attended Basic Officers Course 4-06 at The Basic School in Quantico, VA. Upon graduation with Delta Company in December 2006, he proceeded to Flight Training in Pensacola, Florida.

In 2008, Major Windt completed Primary Flight Training in the T-34C Turbo Mentor at NAS Whiting Field, Milton, FL and was selected to attend jet training in Meridian, MS. Upon completion of Advanced Jet Training in the T-45C Goshawk in 2009, Major Windt received his Wings of Gold and was selected to fly the AV-8B Harrier.

Major Windt completed the AV-8B Fleet Replacement Squadron syllabus in Cherry Point, NC, and reported to the "Blacksheep" of Marine Attack Squadron 214 aboard Marine Corps Air Station Yuma, AZ in October 2010. As a "Blacksheep," Major Windt served as the S-1 Officer, Adjutant, Schedule Writer, NATOPS Officer, and Aviation Safety Officer and deployed with the $31^{\rm st}$ Marine Expeditionary Unit aboard the USS Essex.

In October 2012, Major Windt deployed as an individual augment to Southwest Asia in support of Operation Enduring Freedom as the Area Air Defense Planner for the $609^{\rm th}$ Air and Space Operations Center.

In July of 2013, Major Windt reported to Marine Wing Support Squadron 371 in Yuma, AZ and assumed command of Airfield Operations Company.

In 2023, Maj Windt assumed his present billet as Headquarters and Headquarters Squadron Yuma Executive Officer and NATOPS Instructor where he continues to fly the UC-12F.
